
Reference: Applying for a City Tree Pruning Permit



DETERMINING IF PERMIT IS REQUIRED

Is the tree in front of my home a City tree? (Figures 1 & 2)

- · Between street and sidewalk: Yes
- Back or side yard: No
- Between street and your house: Check with the City for measurement from the edge of the pavement toward your home.
- Curb attached sidewalk: Check with the City for measurement from the edge of the street toward your home.




If the tree is located on City right-of-way, you will need to apply

for a tree pruning permit. However, the City provides "life/safety" pruning that includes raising low limbs from over the street and sidewalk (14'/8'), and pruning out larger deadwood (2" diameter or better). To be placed on the "life/safety" pruning list, call Public Works Dispatch at 503-588-6333. In addition, Administrative Rule Chapter 109, division 500, section 002, 2.7 allows pruning City trees without a permit under the following conditions:

On trees that have at least a 4-inch dbh (the diameter of a tree at 4.5' from the ground–4" dbh, 12.5" circumference), up to three tree branches and three tree roots two inches or less in diameter may be pruned per year without a permit using accepted arboricultural practices.

To protect trees from limbs ripping out when pruning, use the 3-Cut Method (Figure 3).



PERMIT APPLICATION PROCESS

When applying for a tree pruning permit, you will need to provide the following information:

- 1. The name of owner of the property abutting the City tree.
- 2. The address of the property owner and the address of the tree, if different.
- 3. The location of the tree relative to the address (e.g., "next to the driveway to my house").
- 4. The intent of the pruning (e.g, raise low limbs and prune out deadwood).
- 5. The approximate date of work.
- 6. The name and contact information of the City-licensed tree contractor who will be doing the work (list attached). If you plan to do the work yourself, enter "Self."

Note: A work in right-of-way application may be required after review of street tree permit application.

Important Information

- 1. Tree work must meet *American National Standard for Tree Care Operations—Tree, Shrub and Other Woody Plant Maintenance—Standard Practices* (ANSI A300), American National Standards Institute. Current edition.
- 2. No reduction in tree/crown height will be allowed, and no more than one-third of the crown may be removed.
- 3. All cost of the pruning and refuse disposal is the resonsibility of the Permit holder.
- 4. All phases of the pruning shall be done in a manner which is safe, protects all persons involved from injury, and protects all property from damage.
- 5. The Permit holder shall hold the City of Salem harmless in case of any injury and/or property damage.
- 6. Obtaining a separate Permit for work in the parking lane and any lane closure shall be the responsibility of the Permit holder. (Construction Maintenance Temporary On-street Parking Permit—PAC Center, Work in Right-of-Way Permit—Public Works Development Services.)
- 7. No work may be done to "Top," or create or maintain a topiary form.

A permit will be issued when the applicant can meet one or more of the following criteria under *Salem Revised Code (SRC)* 86.070 Tree Pruning and Certain Criteria:

- a. A City tree is encroaching onto private property and causing injury to privately-owned trees or shrubs.
- b. A City tree is having an adverse effect on adjacent infrastructure or buildings that may be resolved by pruning or treatment.
- c. A City tree's branches pose a threat to utility lines, cables, or other overhead structures.
- d. The pruning or treatment proposed is unlikely to harm the City tree.
- e. A City tree is obstructing clearance areas/zones as established in applicable administrative rules or Public Works Design Standards. (Ord No. 23-15)
