Subject: Amended Budget Proposal

As previously discussed during budget conversations, because the proposed increase in maximum indebtedness was approved by both the Urban Renewal Agency and City Council, we now have the opportunity to add funding to the budget towards priority projects.

Attached is the budget recommended by NGRAB this past spring. Amendments to the budget are outlined below and match what was proposed within the financial report developed as part of the maximum indebtedness process. If the proposed modifications are approved \$5,167,030 will remain available for future projects.

The funds added include:

• Grant Program: \$1 million

• Development Infrastructure Assistance: \$750,000

• Affordable Housing Assistance: \$300,000

Subject: Additional Grant Programs

As part of the increase in maximum indebtedness the board directed funds during the first few years to specific uses: Development Infrastructure Assistance and Affordable Housing Assistance. The conversation for these funds was the result of high demand for the grant program over the past two years and a desire to make a conscience effort to both diversify the types of projects being able to be funded and meet the goals of the URA/City as well.

Staff is proposing to put both the new grant categories under the existing program, meaning they would be administered the exact same as the current grant program. Language would be added to the website explaining what these new grant categories can fund and although there would be a separate grant application, minus small tweaks, it would be the exact same as the application currently completed for the existing grant program.

Based on how administration of the program goes and the demand for funds, we would then come back to the board during the next budget conversation to discuss if any changes need to be made.

The maximum grant award amount would remain at \$300,000, this would be for total grant funds. Therefore, if someone wanted a total of more than \$300,000 using multiple grant funding categories it would be considered an exemption and would have to go to the Urban Renewal Agency for approval.

Program Goals/Definitions for Eligibility

<u>Affordable Housing Grant:</u> Funding assistance for the purposes of capital improvements of existing multi-family housing units to Housing Quality Standards and/or development of new multi-family housing units. For the purposes of this funding source "affordable" is defined as being no more than x%* above the annual rates published HUD (Housing and Urban Development).

<u>Development Infrastructure Grant:</u> Target providing financial assistance to those properties in which development is a challenge due to lack of necessary city infrastructure including; water, sewer, fiber, gas/electric service to site.

*Percentage to be provided by the Salem Housing Authority Interim Director.

**As previously discussed, the activities listed above were/are eligible within the standard grant program. However, this delineation of funds would ensure available funding for these activities and would assist in providing for a balanced issuance of grant funds.
