 Land Use Update & Reports, John Latimer, Land Use Chair. Proposal for Bike path options discussed as part of Bond. Note was made that we can dilute this to the point where not much gets done on anything. Schurman development. We await a final plan from the builder. Some changes in parking space and tree preservation are developing. Watch for updates. Wren Heights first home under construction. Parcels for sale. Streets open and accessible. New Owners declared intent to fill the land and make it serviceable, not to re-open the quarry. Intent is to "lay back the walls of the quarry" Development of the rock pit will be more in line for development of a personal use home site. This is a 19.3 acre site they hope to build a new home on. Proposed AIR-BnB reviewed with homeowner and local realtor. Her spoken intent is to move here, eventually. Several requests regarding the legality and city process detailed and laid out by the homeowner. Questions about pricing and seasonal adjustments fielded.
