SUMMARY: A proposal to install a new monument sign at the Gilbert House Children's Museum.

REQUEST: A Class 2 Minor Historic Design review of a proposal to install a new monument sign on the north side of the Gilbert House Children's Museum, which includes the A.C. Gilbert House (1887), individually listed on the National Register, the Rockenfeld-Bean House (1883), and Parrish House (1860), all designated Salem Local Landmarks, located at 116 Marion St. NE, 97301 (Marion County Assessor Map and Tax Lot number: 073W22DB 07400).

In the matter of the application for a Minor Historic Design Review submitted by Alicia Bay on behalf of the Gilbert House Children's Museum, the Historic Preservation Officer (a Planning Administrator Designee), having received and reviewed evidence and the application materials, makes the following findings and adopts the following order as set forth herein.

REQUEST

Summary: A proposal to install a new monument sign at the Gilbert House Children's Museum.

Request: A Class 2 Minor Historic Design review of a proposal to install a new monument sign on the north side of the Gilbert House Children's Museum, which includes the A.C. Gilbert House (1887), individually listed on the National Register, the Rockenfeld-Bean House (1883), and Parrish House (1860), all designated Salem Local Landmarks, located at 116 Marion St. NE, 97301 (Marion County Assessor Map and Tax Lot number: 073W22DB 07400).

A vicinity map illustrating the location of the property is attached hereto, and made a part of this decision (Attachment A).

FINDINGS

1. Minor Historic Design Review Applicability

SRC230.020(f) requires Historic Design Review approval for any alterations to historic resources as those terms and procedures are defined in SRC 230. The Planning Administrator shall render a decision supported by findings that explain conformance or lack thereof with relevant design standards, state the facts relied upon in rendering the decision, and explain justification for the decision.

BACKGROUND & PROPOSAL

The proposed metal and Lexan monument sign is 98" wide by 58" high, approximately 36 square feet in size. The sign will be freestanding, with concrete footings installed into the ground and will be located at the northwest corner of the site, facing Water Street NE, where their temporary signage is currently located. The applicant's submittal plans are included as **Attachment B**.

SUMMARY OF RECORD

The following items are submitted to the record and are available: 1) all materials and testimony submitted by the applicant, including any applicable professional studies such as traffic impact analysis, geologic assessments, stormwater reports, and; 2) materials, testimony, and comments from public agencies, City Departments, neighborhood associations, and the

APPLICANT'S STATEMENT

A request for historic design review must be supported by proof that it conforms to all applicable criteria imposed by the Salem Revised Code. The applicants submitted a written statement, which is included as **Attachment B** in this staff report.

Staff utilized the information from the applicant's statements to evaluate the applicant's proposal and to compose the facts and findings within the staff report. Salem Revised Code (SRC) 230.0062 Signs in Public Historic Districts-(c)New Signs are the applicable criteria for evaluation of this proposal.

FACTS & FINDINGS

1. Historic Designation

Under Salem Revised Code (SRC) Chapter 230, no exterior portion of a local historic resource, contributing, non-contributing building or new construction in a historic district shall be erected, altered, restored, moved or demolished until historic design review approval has been granted on the basis of the project's conformity with the applicable criteria in SRC 230. Conditions of approval, if any, shall be limited to project modifications required to meet the applicable criteria.

According to SRC 230.020(f), historic design review approval shall be granted if the application satisfies the applicable standards set forth in Chapter 230. For Class 1 and Class 2 Minor Historic Design Review decisions HLC staff, the Historic Preservation Officer (a designee of the Planning Administrator), shall render their decision supported by findings that explain conformance or lack thereof with relevant design standards, state the facts relied upon in rendering the decision, and explain justification for the decision.

2. Historic Significance

This site was originally established by Salem City Council as "Heritage Village" in the 1986 Salem Riverfront Master Plan. The plan included a provision to provide six building sites to form a complete block of relocated historic structures enclosing a large outdoor area which would be landscaped in a manner similar to the residential gardens of the late 1800s. The children's museum opened in 1989, initially in the A.T. Gilbert House, which was already on the site along with the National Register listed Wilson-Durbin House (1861), fronting Water Street. The Wilson-Durbin House burned in 1990.

A.T. Gilbert was the uncle of the famous toymaker A.C. Gilbert – a Salem native credited as the "man who saved Christmas." Gilbert was most famous for his "Erector Set," a metal toy construction kit that contained a motor. During World War I, Gilbert led an appeal to stop a proposal banning toy production in favor of wartime materials, thus his title.

Between 1990 and 1998, the City of Salem moved three more buildings to the site. Two were purchased from the State of Oregon and needed to be relocated due to the Capitol Mall expansion: the J. L. Parrish House (c1860), originally located at 745 Capitol Street, was moved in 1990; and the Rockenfield-Bean House (1883), originally located at 755 Capitol St, was moved in 1991. Both buildings were added to Salem's Local Historic Landmark Inventory. In 1996, the City moved the Little Gem Grocery (1925) to the site. This building was originally on the northwest corner of Chemeketa and 17th. The City purchased the building after an effort by the Court-Chemeketa Historic Renewal Inc. to rescue it from demolition.

In 1999, the Wilson-Durbin House was reconstructed, and while initially listed on the National Register, is no longer eligible due to the loss of original historic materials. The Gilbert House Children's Museum campus currently includes the following designated structures: A.T. Gilbert House (1887), individually listed on the National Register, the Rockenfield-Bean House (1883), and Parrish House (1860), all designated Salem Local Landmarks. In 2012, the Bubble Room was removed from the A.T. Gilbert House's front parlor due to a flood which caused significant damage. In 2019 approval was received for Phase I of the Inventors Yard improvements. These improvements included construction of two new accessory structures, replace existing ramps and fencing, install security camera at the gilbert House Children's Museum campus (HIS19-40). CPR 22-04 authorized the removal of cupboards on the interior of the Parrish House.

3. Neighborhood and Citizen Comments

The subject property is located within the Central Area Downtown Neighborhood Association (CANDO). A Request for Comments was sent to the neighborhood association, and surrounding property owners within 250 feet of the property pursuant to Salem Revised Code (SRC) requirements on November 9, 2022. The CANDO Neighborhood Association submitted an email on November 14, 2022, stating that CANDO supports the proposal to install a new monument sign. No additional comments were received from the neighborhood association or from adjoining property owners.

4. City Department and Public Agency Comments

The Building and Safety Division indicates that the applicant must obtain required sign permits. The Planning Division has reviewed the proposal and states that the signage meets the applicable requirements for signage in SRC 900 and the signage must be reviewed for compliance with the Willamette Greenway Standards as part of the sign permitting process. The Fire Department and Public Works Department had no concerns regarding the proposal.

5. Historic Design Review

SRC Chapter 230.0062 *Signs in Public Historic Districts-(c)New Signs* is the applicable criteria for this case. Table 230-1 defines this activity as a Class 2 Minor Historic Design Review. Historic Landmarks Commission staff reviewed the project proposal and has the following findings for the applicable criterion.

FINDINGS:

Criteria 230.062 Signs in Public Historic Districts (c)New Signs.

(1) Be compatible with the size, scale, and design of the historic resource.

Finding: The proposed permanent signage will be constructed of metal and acrylic. The proposed metal monument sign is 98" wide by 58" high, approximately 36 square feet in size. The sign will be freestanding, with concrete footings installed into the ground and will be located at the northwest corner of the site, facing Water Street NE, where their temporary signage is currently located. This signage is compatible with the size, scale and design of the A.C. Gilbert House (1887), individually listed on the National Register, the Rockenfeld-Bean House (1883), and Parrish House (1860), all designated Salem Local Landmarks. Staff finds that this standard has been met.

(2) Be located where they do not obscure significant features of a historic resource.

Finding: None of the proposed signage is proposed to be attached to the historic resources on the site, and no significant features will be obscured by installation of the proposed signage. Staff finds that this standard has been met.

(3) Use materials that are compatible with and characteristic of the period of significance.

Finding: The proposed freestanding signage is of steel and Lexan (acrylic). The steel is characteristic of the period of significance. While the LEXAN is a modern material, this is a common signage material currently used throughout Salem historic districts, and is compatible with the resources on the site. Staff finds that this standard has been met.

(4) Be attached in a manner that prevents damage to historic materials.

Finding: The proposed signage is freestanding and therefore will not be attached to any historic resources on the site, therefore no historic materials will be damaged as a result of the installation of the new signage. Staff finds that this standard has been met.

(5) Any sign identifying the use of the building or structure shall be limited to the minimum size necessary to provide such identification.

Finding: The applicant is proposing to replace an existing temporary sign with a permanent freestanding sign in the same location, and approximately the same size as this temporary signage. No other signage exists on the site. The applicant is proposing to light the sign with LED's inside the LEXAN panels, and further is proposing to up-light the signage with an LED light. In order to better meet this criterion, the following CONDITIONS of APPROVAL are adopted:

Condition 1: Lighting shall not exceed 366 watts (or 250 nits) between sunset and sunrise;

Condition 2: The freestanding monument sign shall not have exposed conduit.

DECISION

Based upon the application materials deemed complete on November 9, 2022 and the findings as presented in this report, the application for HIS22-34 is **APPROVED** with the following **CONDITIONS of APPROVAL:**

Condition 1: Lighting shall not exceed 366 watts (or 250 nits) between sunset and sunrise;

Condition 2: The freestanding monument sign shall not have exposed conduit.




