PROPOSAL / REQUEST:

Class 4 Legislative Major Historic Review of a proposal to designate the Civic Center (c.1972), as a local historic resource, zoned PS (Public Service), and located at 555 Liberty Street SE 97301; Marion County Assessors Map and Tax Lot numbers: 073W27BD00100 and 073W27BA03200.

HEARING PROCEDURE:

The hearing will be conducted with the staff presentation first, followed by the applicant's case, neighborhood organization comments, testimony of persons in favor or opposition, and rebuttal by the applicant, if necessary. The applicant has the burden of proof to show that the approval criteria can be satisfied by the facts. Opponents may rebut the applicant's testimony by showing alternative facts or by showing that the evidence submitted does not satisfy the approval criteria. A hearing is not a venue to ask questions of staff, the applicant, or the decision maker(s) on this case but rather an opportunity to provide testimony to the decision maker(s) on the merits of the land use case; questions about the application, the recommended conditions of approval, or the Planning Administrator's recommendation, should be directed to the Case Manager prior to the hearing.

Any participant may request an opportunity to present additional evidence or testimony regarding the application. A ruling will then be made to either continue the Public Hearing to another date or leave the record open to receive additional written testimony. Failure to raise an issue in person or by letter prior to the close of the Public Hearing with sufficient specificity to provide the opportunity to respond to the issue, precludes appeal to the Land Use Board of Appeals (LUBA) on this issue. A similar failure to raise constitutional issues relating to proposed conditions of approval precludes an action for damages in circuit court.

Following the close of the Public Hearing a decision will be issued and mailed to the applicant, property owner, affected neighborhood association, anyone who participated in the hearing, either virtually or in writing, and anyone who requested to receive notice of the decision.



HLC RESOLUTION NO. <u>2022-02</u>

A RESOLUTION INITIATING THE LOCAL HISTORIC RESOURCE DESIGNATION FOR THE CIVIC CENTER, LOCATED at 555 LIBERTY ST. SE (MARION COUNTY ASSESSOR'S TAX LOT NUMBERS 073W27BD00100 and 073W27BA03200).

Whereas, a Council priority is *Welcoming and Livable Neighborhoods* which includes ensuring that Salem residents have access to historic and cultural opportunities by supporting Salem's historically and culturally significant buildings and sites; and

Whereas, the Salem City Council adopted the updated 2020-2030 Salem Historic Preservation Plan (Plan)as components and support documents to the Salem Area Comprehensive Plan in 2020; and

Whereas, the Plan's adopted Goal 6 is: Survey and Designate Historic Resources; and

Whereas, the City of Salem is a Certified Local Government and has a historic preservation program that includes a preservation ordinance and a local Historic Landmarks Commission (HLC) that meets regularly and maintains a register of locally designated historic resources; and

Whereas, the National Park Service designated the Salem Civic Center on November 2, 2022 as an important local example of the Brutalist architectural style as well as an excellent representation of the ideals of Salem's community planning and development in the late 1960s/early 1970s; and

Whereas, A local historic resource designation may be initiated by the Historic Landmarks Commission by resolution pursuant to SRC 230.010(c)(1)(B); and

Whereas, the Historic Landmarks Commission is required to provide appropriate public notice, consider the matter at a public hearing and make a recommendation regarding the findings relating to the applicable criteria for local historic resource designation in SRC 230.010 to the City Council pursuant to SRC 300.1110; and

Whereas, a 35-day notification to the Department of Land Conservation and Development is required under SRC 300.1110(d).

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED THAT THE HISTORIC LANDMARKS COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF SALEM. OREGON RESOLVES AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. The Historic Landmarks Commission hereby initiates the local historic resource designation for the Salem Civic Center located at 555 LIBERTY ST. SE (Marion County Assessor's Tax Lot 073W27BD00100).

Section 2. The Historic Landmarks Commission shall consider the matter at a public hearing at their December 15, 2022 meeting and will adopt findings and a recommendation to the City Council for their consideration and final decision at a public hearing which will be set for a future date.






