6. ITEMS REQUIRING ACTION

- 1. Gerry Frank Salem Rotary Amphitheater Strategic Plan (Kathleen Swarm)
 - Q: Gaelen McAllister asked if it would be possible to see expenditures vs .revenues listed. Jennifer Kellar was unsure if figures could be tracked and noted that way but will look into it and get them to Chris Neider if possible.
 - Q: Ryan Gail asked how they solicit vender feedback.
 - A: Kathleen indicated open communication is primary, but post event meetings have also proven very useful and helpful.
 - Q: What is the most repeated question of concern that comes up?
 - A: The Permit Process, and a general sense it is difficult to navigate, but Kathleen noted it is a necessary tool, and they just work closely with customers to get through it.
 - Q: Biggest take-away after one year?
 - A: Sense of the value and privilege to bring this amazing venue to Salem and see momentum growing. Kathleen acknowledged her thanks and appreciation to PW staff and parks staff for great support.
 - Q: Derek Gilbert asked how you will attract world class talent?
 - A: Working to build relationships with professional promoters and having a great reputation. Kathleen noted they also work with Travel Salem and incorporate their expertise.
- Public Acknowledgement of Potential Conflicts of Interest by CTPAB.
 Omar Alvarado recused himself from Odyssey applications. Geoffrey Tiffany noted he was on the Willamette Master Chorus Board.
- 3. Review of TOT Event Grant Applications for:
 - SenateAires Youth In Harmony \$8,250 Requested Bob Cox and Kevin Stephens present.
 - Kevin shared SenateAires has a focus on building across all generations, having members from 10 to 90. They are working with the YMCA to build the youth chorus.

They will teach their members to read music and take steps to make sure all are welcome.

Casa de la Cultura Tlanese – Dia de Muertos - \$10,000 Requested. Paola and Feliz Sumosa present. They are a non-profit that has been operating in the Salem area for 13+ years, promoting cultural celebrations and events featuring dance – all ages. Dia de Muertos is a very beloved and popular event, honoring loved ones.

Huapango Huasteco Contest in Salem - \$10,000 Requested. Paola shared about the dance contest, a very popular event in Mexico. Bringing it to Salem and growing it as another fond cultural celebration, that also includes dance teaching is her goal. Gaelen shared a link in the chat to another organization (Oregon Cultural Trust) that provides funding for cultural events.

Festival Chorale Oregon – Stabat Mater Concert - \$10,000 Requested. Bryan Gonzalez was present. Bryan is excited to be back to live concerts and shared about the upcoming performance details. Gaelen McAllister asked how they track demographics. Bryan noted they share a ½ page survey at all performances, designed to collect demographics, It has been used since 2018, with a 48-50% response. It is also explained and announced during opening remarks.

Oregon State Capital Foundation – Cherry Blossom Day - \$7,000 Requested. Genoa Ingram was present. She noted the event is well received and growing. The addition of the Nighttime Viewing of the Cherry Blossoms last year will be added, back by popular demand, this year as well.

Salem Main Street Association – Downtown Salem Winter Celebration - \$10,000 Requested, Derek Gilbert was present. A lot of people and volunteer hours were donated last year. 75,000 Christmas lights and a Christmas parade were brought back to downtown. 6000-7000 people attended last year. Derek hopes to grow the event and help revitalize the downtown over the Holiday season. Gaelen noted the great compilation of donors for last year's event.

Salem Public Library Foundation – Salem Reads, Born a Crime by Trevor Noah, \$10,000 Requested. Focusing on fiction and Hispanic Authors for the 2024 season. Felipe noted and appreciated the SPLF's commitment to diversity and inclusion in their book and author selection and the events hosted.

Willamette Master Chorus – Winter and Veteran's Concert Series, \$10,000 each Requested. Jessica Carpenter was present to discuss the two grant requests. Gaelen noted the \$9,000 for marketing. Radio and print advertising, concert posters, and social media advertising. Jessica noted they spend about \$2500 per concert towards marketing.

Willamette University Theatre 33 – 2023 Summer New Play Festival - \$10,000 Request. Thomas Nabhan was present. They are a new play development

company producing new plays by Oregon and NW playwrights. This will be their 10th annual Summer Festival coming up. Have produced 37 plays by 28 playwrights, assisting playwrights in development of their plays. This is a unique and valuable service not many provide. A high school playwright course is also provided via scholarship to help develop upcoming students in the playwright and production experience. Tom wants the festival to grow into a Regional Festival by 2025. Tom was pleased to see how many are already traveling (26%) more than 50 miles to be involved in their performances. Tickets are donation based to be inclusive of all audiences and the entire community. Gaelen asked Chris to confirm if they are allowed to apply in this bracket. They are a 501-C-9 organization.

Odyssey Collection – Music in the Park Soiree - \$ 2,000 Requested. Omar Alvarez was present. Creating more spaces for music and art locally.

Sasquatch Sports – 2023 Capital City Classic - \$ 2,000 Requested. Chris Roche was present. Noted the event has grown every year and has been hugely successful in recent years. Event spans 11 days in December at local colleges, universities, and high schools. Growth of girls and youth events have progressed. Media is traded, which keeps the budget reasonable. TOT money helps bring in players from out of state. Gaelen asked if they work with Travel Salem. The answer is yes. The Sports development programming with Travel Salem is growing, so there is room to grow the relationship in promoting sports on a larger level moving forward.

Enlace Cross Cultural Community Development Project - 2023 Kermez - Hispanic Month Closing Celebration \$2,000 Requested. Amador Aguilar was present. Offers educational programs through music, dance, cultural and technical training and experiences across the community. Multi-organization collaboration is their business model to promote and support local businesses and cultural experiences. Gaelen loves bringing multiple organizations together to promote and support cultural events.

Press-Play Salem – Press Play Salem Magazine – \$2,000 Requested. Felipe noted what a well-done magazine it is and how well they promote Salem.

Salem on the Edge Gallery – Plein Air Invitational Art Show - \$2,000 Requested. Melanie Weston was present. Explained Plein Air Artists produce a painting out in the midst of the public, then the new paintings are displayed at the Gallery for an event night open to all.

Keizer-Salem Youth Basketball Association – Oregon State Youth Basketball Tournament 2024 - \$7,500 Requested. Llyod Fobi was present. Gaelen had a budget question. \$228,000 profit listed. Lloyd noted that would be for all events the entire year. Gaelen asked to make the profit specific to the one event, so the Board can see what profits are actual and how great is the need for funding. Lloyd noted he would get the event specific amounts to Chris Neider.

Salem Health will have an event Feb 9th featuring Experts on Aging and How to Advocate for Older Adults. Ryan Gail shared the link in the chat.
