# Six-Month Crime Statistics, January – June Four-Year Comparison

## Executive Summary:

ISU is providing information on the first six months of NIBRS statistics on eight crime types: homicide, rape, robbery, aggravated assault, burglary, motor vehicle theft, larceny (all types), and arson.

Counts for all crimes except homicide and arson decreased from last year. The count of all crimes is the lowest of the four years.

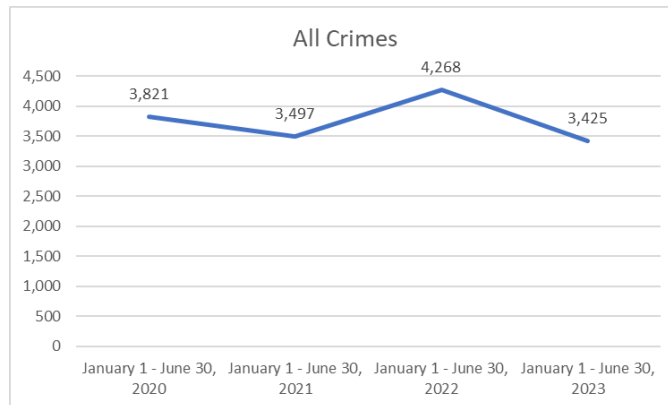
Homicide, rape, robbery, and aggravated assault are categorized as Violent Crime. Burglary, motor vehicle theft, larceny, and arson are categorized as Property Crime.

Crimes against persons (homicide, aggravated assault, and rape) are tallied based on the number of victims of the crime. Motor vehicle thefts are tallied by the number of vehicles stolen. Other crimes (arson, burglary, larceny, and robbery) are tallied by the number of incidents.

When compared to the next five largest cities in Oregon (Eugene, Gresham, Bend, Hillsboro, and Beaverton), Salem has the highest crime rates per 1,000 population, using the NIBRS information provided to OSP for January 1 through June 30, 2023.

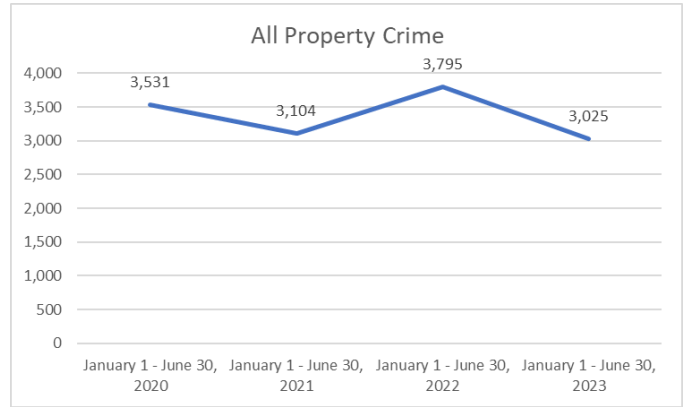
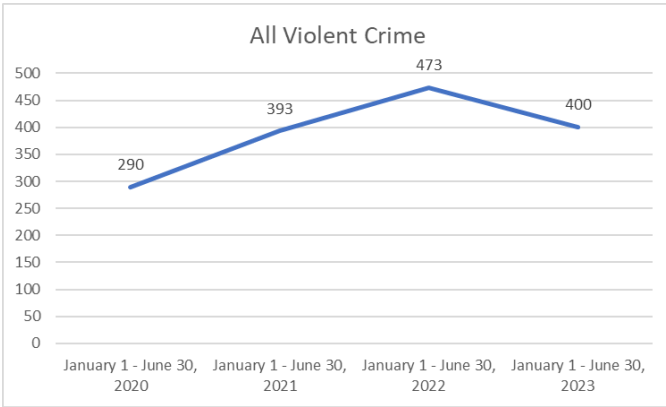
The number of crimes recorded so far in 2023 have been lower than in 2022. The overall number of crimes is the lowest since 2020, with most of the reduction occurring in property crimes.

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# Violent Crime

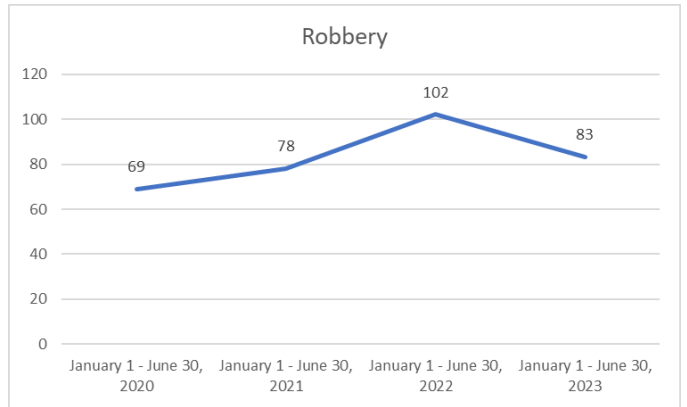
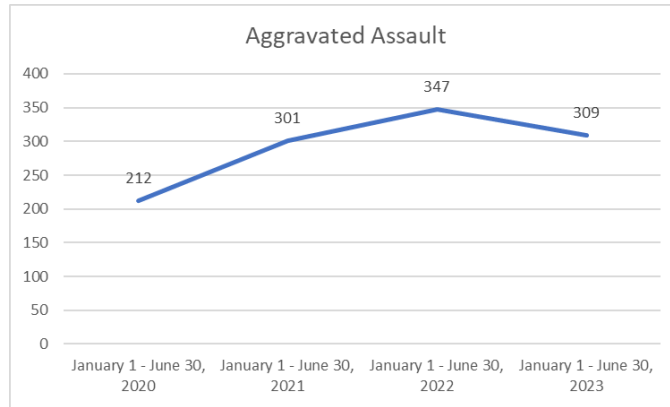
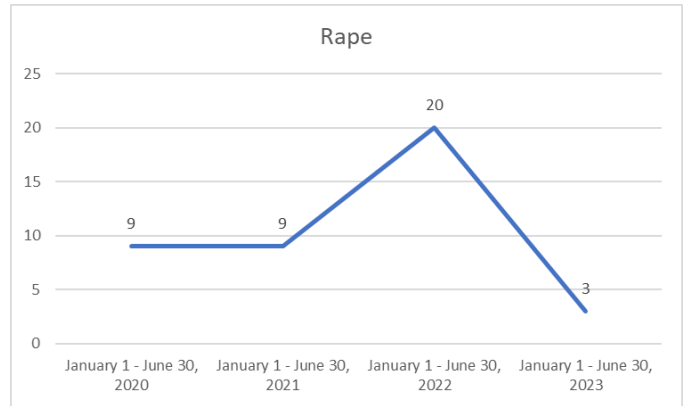
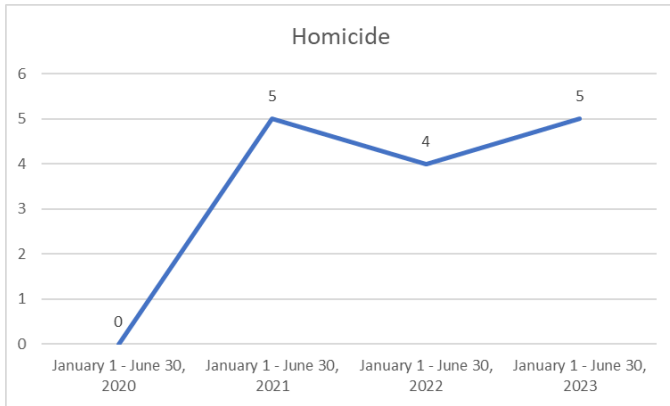
Violent crime is at the second highest count for the past four years.

2020 had no homicides at this point in the year. 2021 through 2023 have had 5, 4, and 5 homicides.

Rapes reached a high of 20 in 2022, and then decreased to 3, the lowest count for the four years, in 2023.

Robbery reached a high of 102 in 2022 and have decreased to the second highest count of 83 in 2023.

Aggravated assault reached a high of 347 in 2022 and has decreased to the second highest count of 309 in 2023.

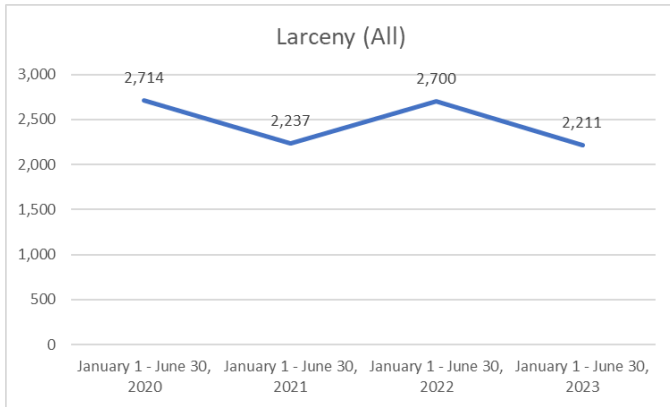
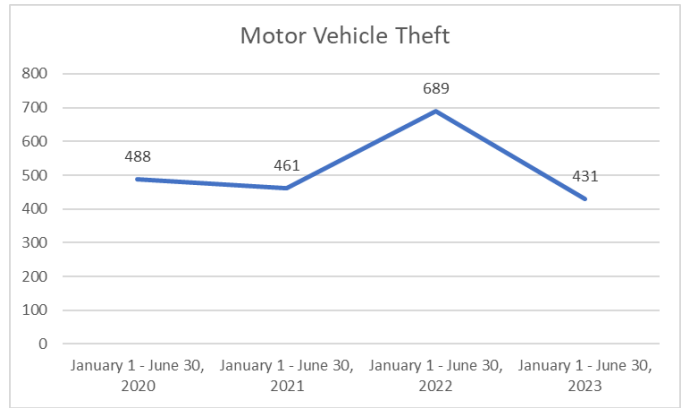
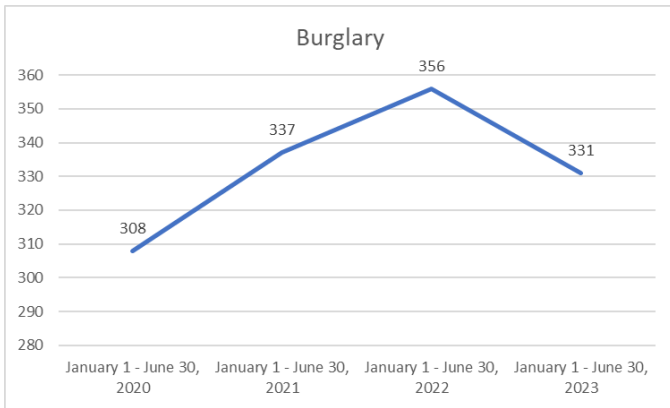
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## Property Crime

Property Crime is the lowest it has been in four years.

Larceny and motor vehicle theft are at the lowest that they have been for four years. Arson increased by two from 2022 but was lower than the high of 2021. Burglary is higher than in 2020, but lower than in 2021 or 2022.

## Comparison to other Oregon Cities (2023 only)

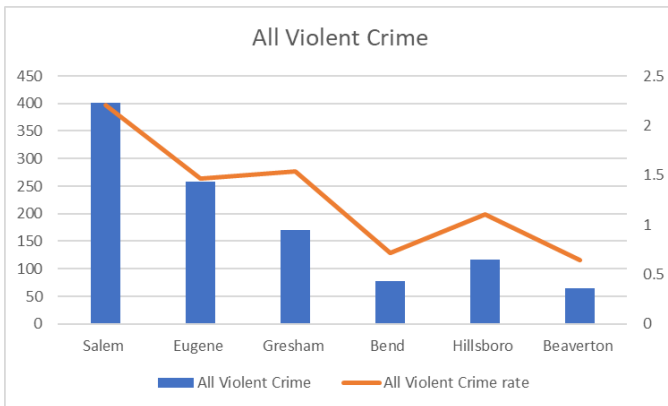
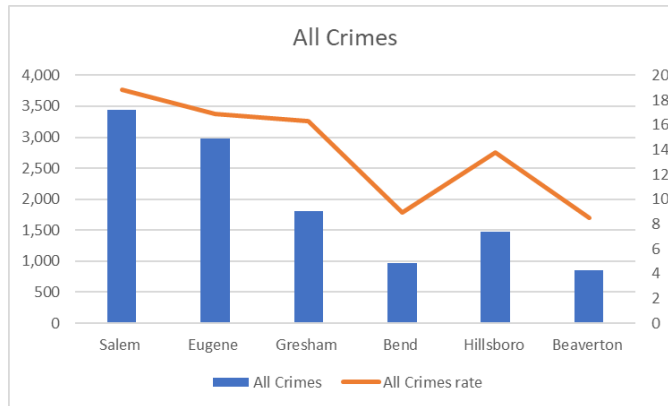

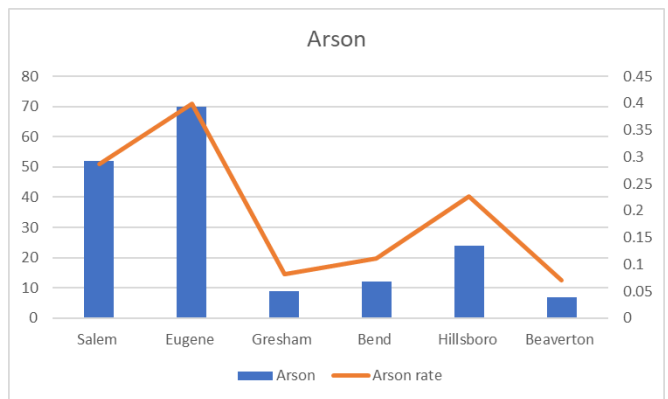
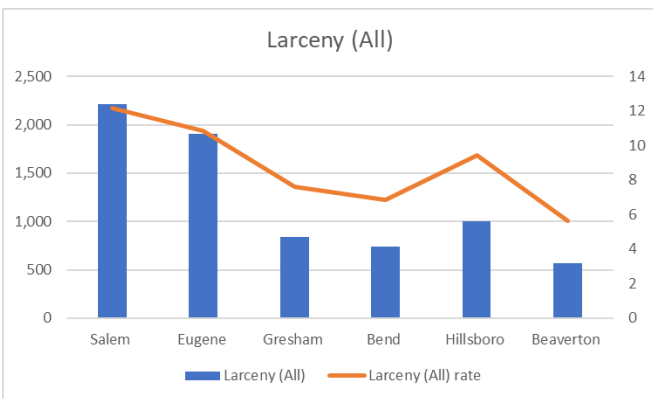
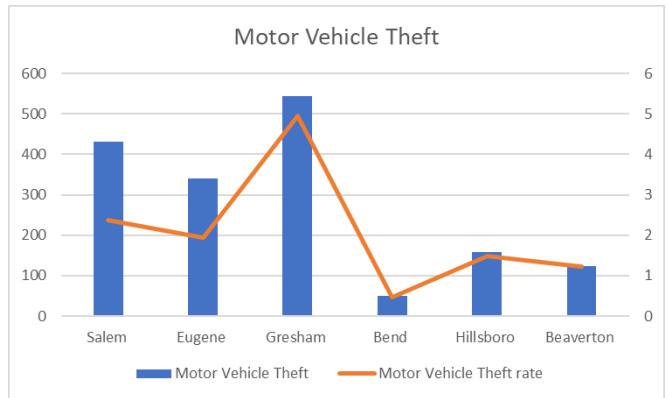
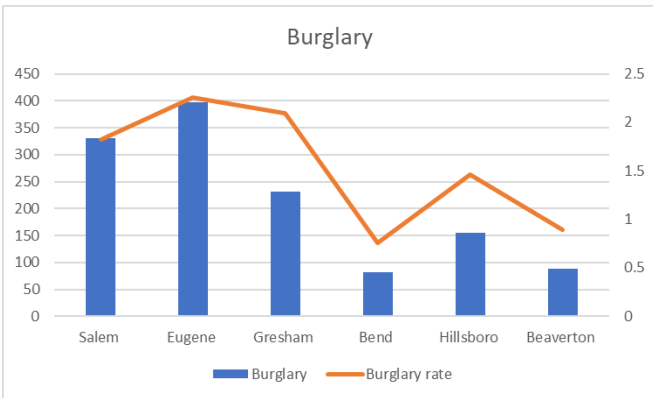
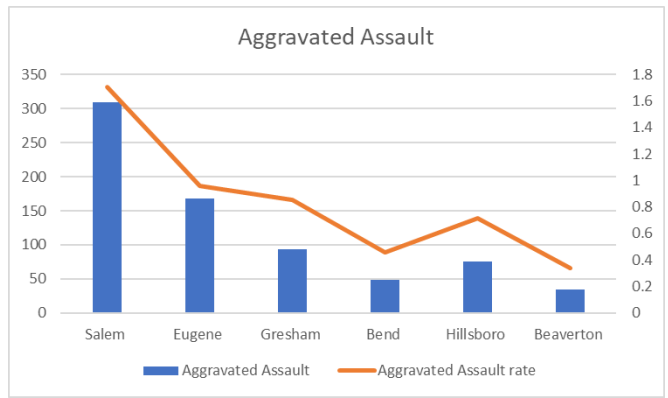
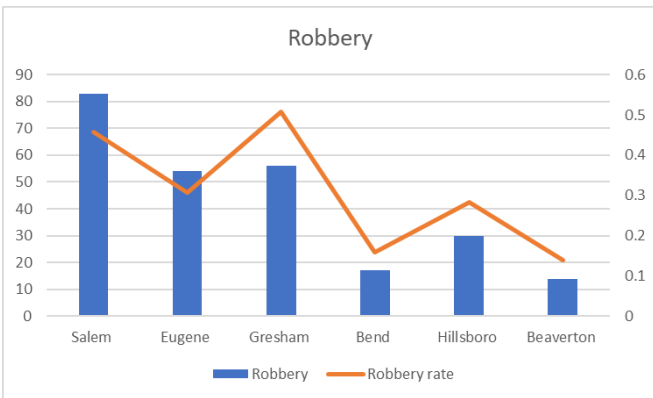
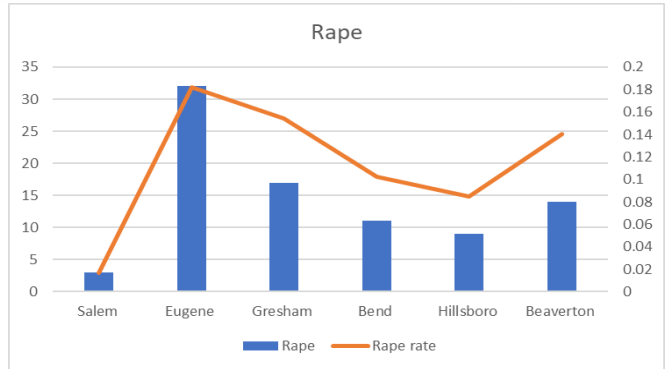
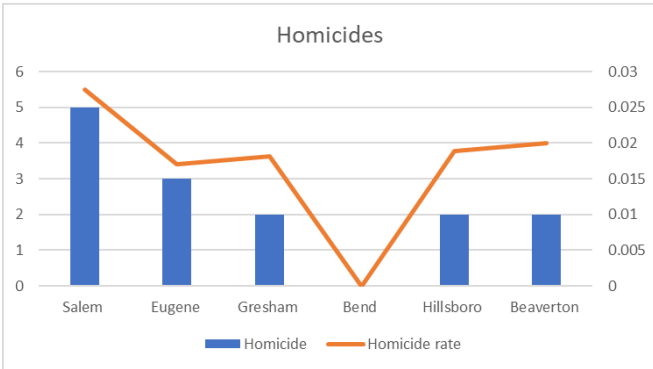
Salem has the lowest reported rape rates of all the listed cities.

Eugene reported higher burglary and arson rates.
