Leo has a desperate crush on the flamboyant new girl and in an earnest, if misguided, attempt to help her avoid bullying, he suggests that she try being more normal.

Vonnegut, Kurt—*Slaughterhouse-Five*

Billy Pilgrim becomes unstuck in time and travels between his adult life, his life as a WWII soldier, and his time as a zoo exhibit on an alien world.

Zindel, Paul—The Pigman

A practical joke on lonely old Angelo Pignati becomes an extraordinary experience for two high schoolers.

Zusak, Markus—The Book Thief
