      - Salem Seekers is a local treasure hunt designed to promote community connectivity, rejuvenate interest in our local parks, and encourage the physical, emotional, and mental well-being of the greater Salem community.
      - The fun-filled events are free for anyone to enjoy and aim to encourage members of our Salem community (and beyond) to step outside their homes, come together, and joyously reclaim our city parks. The treasure-seeking,

month-long events are known for their iconic glass-blown birds, safely hidden in local parks to be found by participants and kept as a gift. This is an effort to support connections in our communities between friends, families, and neighbors - fostering the intended vision of our city parks while creating a lasting memory.

- Last year was a huge success with over 900 participants from all over the city in attendance at four Salem events!
- Request to support event at River Road Park: \$450
- What the funds will provide:
  - 30 glass-blown birds (\$13.50/ea) created by local Glass Art Oregon to be hidden "in plain sight" (these events are designed to be accessible and inclusive) at River Road Park during one of four summer months (June, July, August or September).
  - Identifying tags with QR codes for each of the birds.
  - Advertising for the event highlighting the chosen park
  - Highlighting Neighborhood Association for its financial support and encouragement in online posts and articles.
