- **1.** Welcome and Call To Order The meeting was called to order at 10:03 a.m.
- 2. Public Comment –Written comment was received from Phil Carver of 350 Salem.
- 3. Approval of Meeting Minutes from January 8, 2024 –

Motion: Commissioner Slater made a motion to accept the minutes. This was seconded by Councilor Phillips. Motion was approved 4-0.

- 4. Strategy TL 24 Charging for City-Controlled Parking Sheri Wahgren & Sara Long (Community Planning and Development Department)
 - Sheri Wahgren provided an update on charging for City-controlled parking.
 - Project costs and timelines identified in the Climate Action Plan for this strategy are shorter and less expensive than Urban Division expects this project to entail.
 - Council approved Urban Division to move forward with an implementation plan.
 - First steps taken include amendments to the Riverfront Urban Renewal Plan and bringing in consultants for financial analysis and a communication and engagement plan.
- 5. Strategy EN 09 Community Green Tariff Riley Peck, Steve Corson, and Wendy Veliz (Portland General Electric)
 - Presented by Riley Peck, Steve Corson, and Wendy Veliz from Portland General Electric (PGE).
 - Overview of the Community Green Tariff Program (CGT) in response to House Bill 2021 regulatory requirements to help communities achieve climate goals ahead of PGE's regulatory requirements.
 - Residents of participating jurisdictions will be enrolled in CGT automatically and can opt-out.
 - Incremental costs of procuring non-emitting resources will be added to participating residents' electricity bills.
 - Communities can work together for a joint program to leverage economies of scale.
 - CGT is administered through PGE.

- Income Qualified Bill Discount customers will not pay more to be enrolled in the CGT program.
- Next Steps: PGE will send out a new draft of the CGT to community stakeholders, then file a
 final draft with the Oregon Public Utility Commission (OPUC) in the next few months. A
 decision from the OPUC is expected by the end of the year. If approved, local governments
 can adopt ordinances and complete participation agreements with PGE.
- PGE's existing "Green Future Plan" has a 25% enrollment rate of Salem customers.

6. Climate Action Plan Updates

- Julianah Douglas presented updates on progress to the climate action plan strategy implementation.
- Follow-up on reporting metrics: The Climate Action Plan Committee agrees to move forward with the 13 proposed metrics.
- Solar Feasibility Study at Salem Airport: A first draft has been completed, and a final draft will be soon to follow. Commissioner Slater requested consideration for small-scale generation in lieu of net metering.
- Urban Heat Island Mapping: Salem is planning on applying as the lead agency of a regional mapping effort for 2025. The efforts include about \$20,000 for the study, 100 volunteers dedicating 5 hours, and seeking out a grant to cover indirect costs.
- EN 11 Climate Champion Partners: Marion County Sustainable Business Network is exploring a Memorandum of Understanding to extend services to west Salem.
- CAP Community Engagement: Updates on engagement efforts with Salem 350, Willamette University, and the University of Oregon Sustainable City Year program.
- Next meeting topics: In-pipe hydroelectric Turbine and Salem Navigation Center Energy Trust of Oregon Upgrades on May 13.
