I live at 860 Alvina St SE. Over the past couple months we have struggled with the activities at 870 Alvina St SE. It appears they are using Alvina St and Norma Ave as their parking lot. We have had anywhere from 5-10+ vehicles parked, taking up all the parking in this area. They are using our driveways to turn around as well as using the intersection of Norma and Alvina to do so. They usually have their driveway empty and unused. They are also parking on either side of the mail box located on Norma Ave and not leaving sufficient space for the mail carrier to pull up and deliver.

When they are proposing to use this property to provide care for up to 18 individuals and 2-3 staff, I don't see how this would not impact our neighborhood. This will increase the traffic by up to 21 cars coming and going daily. It will also take parking away from visitors and contractors that will be in the area.

It is also notes on the application that this business activities will limit the impact upon the neighboring properties due to the hours during the workday when most residents of the neighborhood are not in the area. This is incorrect. Several of the neighbors are retired or work from home. I have already witnessed one of my neighbors caregivers having difficulty finding parking.

Good morning Mr. Brown. We are neighbors of the proposed Adult Day Care Center proposed at 870 Alvina Street SE, Salem, OR. Our address is 5450 Norma Ave. SE, Salem OR and are immediately NE across the street from the proposed facility. We have several concerns we would like to share with you, specifically the following:

- 1. All materials, notices and the planners final assessment have failed to determine the impact to Norma Ave. Norma Ave. has a terminus right at the corner of Alvina and as such, can get extremely congested in the best of times, let alone with multiple cars parked on Norma and Alvina simultaneously.
- 2. The terminus of Norma into Alvina is a curve and it is on the almost bottom of a downhill slope coming from Norma. On days when there is icy conditions, snow or rain, that turn from Norma onto Alvina can be treacherous. We have seen cars that have had trouble navigating that curve (where the proposed facility actually is located by the way), including one that crashed into the light pole at the end of Norma/Avlina after a particularly bad snow storm.
- 3. When cars are parked near our driveway, either on our side of the street or across the street, it significantly narrows the right of way, making our driveway difficult to back out of at times. We have also seen cars parked alongside the community mailbox, blocking local neighbor's ability to park if needed.
- 4. The curve at Alvina/Norma is also tight and parked cars make a narrow passage around the corner tight. Those of us in the neighborhood know to be careful but we are concerned that people not familiar with the current challenges of the neighborhood streets will cause additional hazards.

One final thought is that the applicant's written statement of April 10, 2024 indicated no immediate impacts to the neighborhood and traffic. I cannot find any indication that the City performed a true, onsite assessment of the situation considering the impact to Norma Ave. is not even discussed.

We urge you to re-assess the impact to the actual neighborhood, specifically high traffic times/parked cars/effect on Norma Ave prior to granting a Conditional Use Permit. We applied the applicant to provide care during the day to seniors as we are also seniors. However, we think the analysis is flawed and the impact on our neighborhood will be greater than what is perfunctory as outline in the hearing reports. Therefore, we cannot support this proposal as written.
