To heal a nation, we have to open the wound and touch the wound and begin to heal together. Learning to care, addressing our trauma as humankind individually and collectively. Get in touch with what's inside and know that that's a part of the journey, not the whole journey. These conversations are a lifestyle, a way of being in life. In order for humanity to rise together we have to stick with what needs attending to, not give up, ask questions and ask instead of assume. We need to grieve for what's been lost, who's been lost and repair the fabric of our connection to one ourselves and one another.
