Temporary Siting Permit is processed using the Type I Application Procedures under SRC Chapter 300.

Submittal requirements

In addition to the application form, please provide:

- 1) If the property owner is not the applicant, documentation from the property owner authorizing the applicant to sign the application.
- 2) A recorded deed/land sales contract with legal description.
- 3) A site plan, drawn to scale, which includes the following:
 - a) The total site area, dimensions, and orientation relative to north of the subject property;
 - b) Existing buildings, structures, parking areas, sidewalks, and landscaped areas on the subject property;
 - c) The location and dimensions of the proposed temporary facility;
 - d) The temporary facility's distance to property lines and its distance to existing buildings, structures, parking areas, and landscaped areas.
- 4) Elevations, drawn to scale, showing the dimensions and height of the temporary facility.
- 5) A statement explaining why the temporary facility is needed at this location (in terms of coverage and/or capacity) and whether a permanent facility is or will be proposed at or near this location

Rules

- 1) The temporary facility shall be in use for not more than 90 days
- 2) The temporary facility shall not be deployed in a permanent manner
- 3) The temporary facility may not have a permanent foundation
- 4) If the temporary facility is being used in order to facilitate continuity of services during maintenance or repair of existing facilities or prior to completion of construction of a new facility, the temporary facility shall be removed within 30 days after the permanent facility is completed
- 5) A permit for a temporary facility may not be renewed or extended
- 6) No new permit may be issued for the same facility within the succeeding six months after the expiration of the initial permit
- 7) The temporary facility may be parked in a paved parking area but must not reduce the number of available parking spaces below the minimum requirement for the use(s) on the subject property
- 8) The temporary facility must not obstruct vehicular or pedestrian traffic
- 9) The temporary facility may not be parked on any public street right-of-way
- 10) The temporary facility is subject to the SRC Chapter 703 height limits applicable to a permanent facility at the proposed location
- 11) The temporary facility is subject to the SRC Chapter 703 setbacks applicable to a permanent facility at the proposed location
- 12) A temporary facility is prohibited where SRC Chapter 703 and the underlying zoning prohibit a permanent wireless communication facility
