



Major Takeaways

- Guiding principles: Overall support
- Example of ideas with high-level of support:
 - Encourage long-term housing affordability
 - Support small businesses and entrepreneurs
 - Promote a mix of uses along corridors and near downtown
 - Promote active recreational opportunities
 - Protect waterways and water/air quality
 - Encourage transit that connects neighborhoods to jobs, services, shops, and schools

Major Takeaways

- **Mixed use:** Lancaster, Commercial S, downtown area, inner West Salem, Commercial/Kuebler area
- Commercial: Distribute throughout Salem/along major roads
- Industrial: Keep generally where it is today
- Multifamily: Distribute throughout Salem and near frequent transit
- Neighborhood hubs: Distribute throughout Salem
- Riverfront Park: Expand north of downtown

Major Takeaways

- Location: Busier streets and/or at intersections
- Size: Generally smaller clusters of businesses
 - 62.2% Support clusters of 3-6 businesses
 - 42.0% Support clusters of 7-10 businesses
- Design:
 - Limitations on height and square footage
 - Primary entrances should face the street


Draft Vision Statement

Include non-automobile modes of transportation, including bicycling, walking and public transportation, in all transportation planning and projects. Ensure the transportation system continues to support motor vehicle travel that serves personal needs, commerce, and emergency response. Plan for new and emerging transportation modes.








Salem's Draft Vision: Proposed Comprehensive Plan Map

Comprehensive Plan Map Process













Proposed Comprehensive Plan Map






Current Comprehensive Plan Map






Preferred Scenario

- Best guess at what might develop through 2035 based on the proposed Comprehensive Plan Map




Access to Frequent Transit

Frequent Transit = 15-minute service Salem's goal is 10.5% of new housing within $\frac{1}{4}$ mile of bus stops with 15-min service



Complete Neighborhoods

A "complete neighborhood" means people live near parks, schools, grocery stores, businesses, transit



Mode Split

	Bike	3%	1.5%	2.1%
	Walk	10%	13.0%	13.7%

Note: Data includes all trips, not just trips to work




Greenhouse Gas Emissions




