- 12:33:57 From Victor Dodier to Everyone: The goal would be more to obtaining the resources to replace the infrastructure. The water / sewer rates were too low for much too long. As a consequence, the resources needed to replace the old pipes weren't built up.
- 12:34:58 From E.M. Easterly to Everyone: Proposed policies may be mandatory or suggestive. Of the list of policies discussed today which ones are staff recommending as mandatory? Why should any of the policies that are not mandatory be included in the Comprehensive Plan?
