

Transit System Element Goal

"A public mass transit system that provides convenient and accessible transit services to the citizens of the Salem Urban Area."



- City does NOT Operate Public Transit
- Salem-Keizer Transit District Cherriots

Larger Boundary

Separate Elected Government

There is overlap –

Buses operate ON City streets

Transit stops are in City right-of-way
