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Airport Manager's Report – January 19, 2022

2022 Taxiway Improvement Project: Carrying over from 2021, this project is expected to begin in May and be completed by end of summer. A brief reminder as to the scope and funding mechanisms of the project:

The FY20 federal supplemental airport grant program, CARES Act matching funds, federal FY20 and FY21 non-primary entitlement grants, and airport operating funds are being used to provide a robust taxiway improvement and maintenance project this summer. Total project cost will be approximately \$2.3 million. The attached map highlights the various work areas:

The blue section is the complete removal and replacement of the concrete portion of Taxiway C to an asphalt taxiway.

The yellow section will be an asphalt mill and overlay of Taxiway K between Taxiways C and A. Taxiway K west of Taxiway A will be renamed Taxiway C, and the remaining portion of Taxiway K will be renamed A2.

The red sections are the removal of asphalt sections of an old closed taxiway, east and west of the Compass Rose.

The green areas are pavement maintenance of a variety of other taxiway surfaces.

Maintenance will include both crack sealing and, in some areas, a seal coat application.

Airport Master Plan Update: The airport expects to kick off its master plan update in mid-2022, at a yet-to-be-determined date. The initiation of the master planning process will be dependent on the federal grant award cycle, which is typically anywhere between May and August. Once the project has been initiated, the grant has been awarded, and a project scope has been approved, a Planning Advisory Committee (PAC) will be formed and will include at least one member of the Airport Advisory Commission. Please let me know if you have an interest in participating, and I will add your name to the list of potential committee members.


Air Service Development: The community's air service development committee continues to have conversations with multiple airlines interested in serving the Salem market, and it is possible that a letter of interest/intent from at least one air carrier could come in early 2022. If a letter of intent is received, it will likely include a request from the airline for the City to waive fees for up to 24 months, which is the maximum allowed by FAA. This request would require an AAC vote to provide a recommendation to Council and then Council approval. The letter of intent would also trigger a formal request to TSA to begin the process of installing of passenger and baggage screening equipment.

The application window for the next round of Small Community Air Service Development (SCASD) grant applications is expected to be open in early 2022, and in its meeting of December 6, 2021, City Council approved the staff request to apply for a SCASD to apply for a grant. As a reminder, should the City be awarded a SCASD grant I will have to return to Council to <u>accept</u> the grant, which would require AAC review and a recommendation to Council, likely sometime this summer.

City Staffing Updates: You may have heard that the Salem City Manager, Steve Powers, announced his retirement effective the end of February. While the City Council conducts its search for a replacement, the Urban Development Director, Kristin Retherford, who is also my supervisor, has been tasked with acting as the Interim City Manager. During that time, along with several other divisions within Urban Development, the Airport will report directly to the Community Development Director, Norman Wright, until a permanent City Manager is hired and the Urban Development Dept. returns to its normal posture.

There is also expected to be a major shift in the makeup of the Salem City Council later this year. The Mayor and several City Councilors have either decided to retire, not seek reelection, or are campaigning for seats in the state legislature or other government organizations.

It is unlikely that these changes will cause any noticeable shift in the day-to-day business of the airport, but there could be unforeseen impacts or delays depending on the situation and depending on whether a permanent City Manager or a newly-seated City Council would be a more appropriate approving authority.
