City Reports

- **Jacob Schofield, Salem Police Department**
 - Bike thefts are on the rise
 - Lock em'up
 - Register your bike
 - Crimereports.com
 - Provide case number so that we can request a report from SPD
- **Deb Romano, Code Compliance**
 - Still four derelict buildings on corner of Hrubetz and Liberty
 - Three garage sales are permitted per year per household
- **Glenn Davis, Public Works department**
 - National Flood Insurance Program
 - Establishes minimum requirements
 - Adopts flood insurance rate maps
 - Storm water Master Plan
 - Computer modeling can now accurately predict floodways and flood plains
 - Current Map is flawed
 - Impacts to development & property owners
 - FEMA rules for determining the floodplain
 - Options
 1. Do not update flood maps
 2. Update flood maps per FEMA (remove berms)
 3. Update flood maps per city (retain berms)
 - Recommendation
 1. The data and modeling methods developed for the stormwater master plan should be used to update the floodplain maps in Salem
 - Effect
 1. New property's might be placed in the floodplain
 - May be required to own flood insurance

2. Help with property purchasing and development

- **Stacy Nelson, Clean Streams Initiative**
 - “Clean Streams, Clear Choices”
 - Impervious surfaces don’t filter water like porous surfaces do
 - Pick up after your pets
 - City contracts with “Friends of Trees” to plant and protect trees along streams and watersheds

- **Lisa Harnish, Yes for Salem-Keizer Schools**
 - \$600million bond
 - Brings many schools up to an equitable level
- **Jon Wiener, Marion county Circuit Court Candidate**
 - Most time spent in civil law (people law)
 - Wants to continue the positive impact on individuals and families
 - Current pro-tem on Salem Municipal Court
