City Reports

• Salem Code Compliance, Officer Ramano

- o Barking dog complaints should be reported to Salem Police non-emergency line.
 - Investigation includes an officer staying in the area for 20min and the dog has to consistently bark for that 20 min to meet the threshold.
- Concerns about side walk conditions should be reported to Salem Public Works.
- It is recommended if you have a property line concern related to fence or branches that you try to work it out with your neighbor. If that is unsuccessful the city does have a neighbor mediation option.
- Trash cans are only allowed in the right-of-way the day prior to, day of, and day after scheduled pickup.
- Discussed Homes/properties and neighbors in the Faye Wright Area that have been of concern in the past.

- Recommendations to not start and leave your car to warm up this time of year. This can lead to car thefts.
- o Discussed Salem Vacation Home Program and opportunity to have the home checked.
- Discussed concerns and past concerns for the area.
