# Officer McDermott shared the following:

- Social media helps the police to get information.
- The old Deleon building will be demolished this month.
- There is targeted speed enforcement on Hollywood.
- No parking sign was installed on Coral.
- McKay Park is patrolled once in a while, less often than they receive calls.

#### Parole and Probation:

- Parole and probation officers have specialized caseloads based on the crime.
- There is a mental health court.

### **Raul Martinez:**

- Raul sits on the board of United Way. United Way has created a Youth Leadership program.
- Youth homelessness is increasing each year in Salem.
- Youth is defined as up to 24 years old.
- \$365,000 of \$400,000 has been raised to purchase a home for youth homeless.

## **Mayor Bennett**

- Residential vacancy rate is between 1-2% in Salem.
- Rents are higher than housing vouchers.
- There are 500 hard to house individuals in Salem. They are hard to house due to health issues, mental illness, alcohol and/or drug issues, felonies and homelessness for over 10 years.
- City has found housing for 35 in the last 7-8 months.
- City is purchasing 35 low income housing units in Hayesville.
- There is an ongoing problem of camping in parks, under overpasses, and the pedestrian path to the bridge to West Salem.
- Downtown homeless tasks force is tackling the needs for bathrooms, showers, and washing machines.
- City is looking at entering into and Inter Governmental Agreement with Oregon Department of Transportation to allow City of Salem to police underpasses for camps.

- Monday, City Council will discuss purchasing 24 low income housing units in Hayesville.
- No parking signs were installed on Coral.
