February's minutes were approved

Councilor Report: Chris Hoy

- This is Chris's first NA meeting since March
- The city is trying to adapt to the pandemic
- They're limiting meetings to urgent matters only
- New police facility coming along nicely
- The library is a shell of a building as they anchor it to keep it from collapsing during an earthquake
- Not in the NA, but close by, Center St. east of Lancaster to Cordon will be improved in 2023. It will include bike lanes and sidewalks
- Also not in the NA but close by, a traffic light will be installed at Silverton Rd. at Hollywood Dr. in 2022
- As part of the same transportation bill, bike lanes and sidewalks will be installed on Hollywood Dr. from Silverton to San Francisco Dr.
- An emergency declaration over protests was made and a curfew set from 11 PM to 6 AM
- Curfew will be in effect until June 8th
- Salem police led one of the marches
- Brown Rd. park is getting a pollinator garden
- The city budget committee approved the city manager's budget
- There will be no budget cuts
- The \$8 operations fee is helping Salem stay within it's budget
- It's possible water rates will go up 3% this fall
- Chief Moore is retiring from the Salem police department this fall

Deanna Garcia: Construction Update

- The housing project on Hollywood has 14 lots
- 8 lots will be accessed by Tierra Dr.
- The 6 lots accessed by Hollywood Dr. will be duplexes
- The "rain gardens" surrounding the sidewalks will provide for additional drainage
- According to the CC and R, (covenants, conditions and restrictions) the neighbors will maintain the rain gardens
- The utilities are now installed
- Paving comes next
