11. What did your organization do to contribute to Salem's appeal as a tourist destination? Highlight one activity that occurred during the period.

As we continued our 125th Anniversary celebration we wrapped up our 'Decades of Deepwood' exhibits and teas in October and November with a focus on the 40s, 50s and 60s. Since our collection only goes through the 1930s (with the exception of the mid-century kitchen decor) this was a fun opportunity to gather donations and loaned home decor, magazines, player piano music, fashion and more for this rare chance to have museum home guests to see the home step into the later years it was a private residence. In January we had began going through the 'Decades of Deepwood' with the 1890s and worked are way through the 1960s month by month.

Docents received historical information about the featured decades to share on guided tours, social media posts focused on the featured decades and our hosted teas encouraged dress of the featured decade. At each decade tea the Executive Director presented historical information about the home and what it's residents were doing during the showcased decade, Salem important news events, photos of the era, favorite foods from the decade and fashions were on display with talks on the key elements of each. In October we held a talk by Salem photographer Ron Cooper about his decades of photographing Deepwood which started while it was still a private residence and continues today.

To celebrate the anniversary and decades focus we also introduced a new front entry Christmas Tree this year which was full of mini-framed images of the people who lived at or played a major role in Deepwood during it's years as a private residence. We included a timeline on an easel by the tree to help people understand the home's rich history. These limited times of focus on each decade gave a sense of urgency for people to come experience the home, memorable experiences for attendees, fun new things for volunteers to learn about and we saw an uptick in museum home visitors YOY by 5%.

12. Report on one of the benchmarks or performance measures used by your organization (provide data and an explanation of how the data was collected).

One of our goals is to be approachable and welcoming to everyone. We realize that goal through a variety of efforts including our two holiday open house days each holiday season where we offer a total of 6 hours (3 hours each Sunday) where anyone can come and experience the Museum home at Deepwood for FREE. We promote the Open Houses through the print and social media, newsletters, signage and event calendars. We do the days in tandem with Bush House Museum to encourage traffic at both museum homes and Salem Art Association. At Deepwood we also host Santa Clause in the solarium on both Open House Sundays to offer an added appeal to young families and the young at heart. Additionally we moved our Holiday Market to coincide with one of the Open House days so attendees to that event may also attend the Open House. Crossover with these events gives a sense of excitement and energy about how much happens year round at Deepwood Museum & Gardens.

We generally have a waiting line when we open the door and over this years two Open House Sundays (6 hours total) we welcomed nearly 800 people. The Executive Director is on the porch in period dress giving a basic home history as people wait to enter, so they take away a bit of knowledge about the home and the City of Salem ownership, as well as TOT funding (including signage).

Visitors experience holiday decor in every room of the home with 12 themed holiday trees related to the home's historic eras. Additionally we have 10-15 volunteers in the home dressed in period costume to answer questions and welcome guests. As people depart through the kitchen they are sent off with cookies, cider and encouragement to visit our neighboring organizations open houses. We also promote upcoming events to encourage attendees to come see us another time during the year. We track attendance numbers and city of residence to get a sense for out of town visitors. We had people travel by train and car from destinations such as Portland, Eugene and Bend for the open houses this year with approximately 20% being outside of a 50 mile radius.. This is also a great time for our local residents to come experience the museum home with holiday decor throughout. We have first time visitors each year, while others make the holiday open house an annual tradition.

11. What did your organization do to contribute to Salem's appeal as a tourist destination? Highlight one activity that occurred during the period.

Our fall exhibit, "Slainte: Celebrating Celtic Cultures" opened on October 4. This exhibit was curated by Ceili of the Valley, a local cultural organization that is dedicated to preserving and promoting Celtic culture, mainly through through music and dance.

In November, Dr. April Overstreet, from Willamette University, brought one of her classes to visit the exhibit. They came to learn more about Galicia, which is considered one of the seven Celtic nations, as part of their coursework. Members of Ceili of the Valley were present to give the students an in-depth overview of Celtic culture as it is expressed in Galicia. Visitors to the gallery came from Washington, California, South Carolina, Pennsylvania, Hawaii, Algeria and El Salvador.

12. Report on one of the benchmarks or performance measures used by your organization (provide data and an explanation of how the data was collected).

Our out-of-area attendance goal in the World Beat Gallery is 20%. During the 2nd quarter, only 14% of visitors to the Gallery came from out-of-area. Visitors came from 5 states and 2 countries. Overall attendance during this quarter was disappointing, down almost 40% from previous years. The Gallery Team is working on ways to step up marketing as we near the end of our first year in a new location. We weren't open quite as many hours this quarter due to temporarily decreased staff levels. With the addition of a new Assistant Director, we anticipate that the number of activities associated with each gallery exhibit will expand and be more consistent from exhibit to exhibit. We are also considering adding additional exhibits as we feel that having only 3-4 exhibits per year limits our reach.
