She has begun the process of streamlining and modernizing the system. 90 percent of the court work is done by the staff. Has reviewed process to eliminate old cases and uncollected warrants. Uses a data driven system and works with a court administrator. To address the issues that she is inefficient and has tripled the pro tem budget, she has looked for ways to make sure that due process of appropriate for the social situations. Some cases have multiple issues which are better solved by coordinating with social service personnel such as veterans with service related alcohol problems.
