Water is Sacred: Water is Life

Exhibition at Hallie Ford Museum of Art through May 13, 2018

Each spring, the Hallie Ford Museum of Art pairs its annual senior art majors exhibition with a small solo exhibition of recent work by one of the faculty members in the art department at Willamette University. This year’s exhibition focuses on recent work by Professor James B. Thompson (American, born 1951), who teaches courses in painting, printmaking, drawing, and design.

In his new body of work, Thompson explores the themes of water and water waste through mixed media paintings on paper, mixed media prints on paper, kiln-formed glass panels, and mixed media sculpture on panels.
