| Minutes               | Modification to the January minutes to include comments about a sound wall along Cordon Road across from the Amazon facility. A motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the January minutes as written with that modification. Motion was made, seconded and approved to accept the February minutes as written.  |
| Agenda                | Motion was made, seconded and passed to amend the January agenda to remove the Mill Creek Development item and add Melissa Parker who is running for the position of Municipal Court Judge. Motion was made, seconded and passed to add a discussion regarding a sound wall bordering Cordon Road in the Marcie Gardens area.  |
| Police                | Officer Owings reported on transit camps; RV's; Wiltse's towing of illegal RV's and their disposal; all parks are now open from sunrise to sunset; there is an 8 hour visitation window at Cascades Gateway Park. Ron Sterba called for a round of applause for the police rapid response to some interlopers in the Center Street area.   |
| Counselor Comments    | Brad Nanke – city council okayed alcohol at sanctioned events as long as it was monitored; Friday at 10 AM there will be a bulldozer starting the take-down at the site of the new police station; budget season is coming up; Mill Creel Industrial Park area sound wall and seniors don't like night meetings.<br>Tom Andersen reported seniors or anyone can watch city council meetings on CCTV; they have a streamlined budget process; Costco zoning; homeless issue downtown; and he is running unopposed for a new term. |
| Municipal Court Judge | Melissa Parker introduced herself and gave her reasons for running for this office.<br>Jane Aiken gave a summary of her accomplishments while in office and her reasons for running for re-election.   |
| Committee Reports     | Transit – 18 months before improvements to the schedule can be implemented that would include late night service, holiday service, and Saturday and Sunday service. Cherriots has a new logo and signs are being changed to note it. They are working on the south Salem transit center. The legislative session deemed that starting in January transit directors would be appointed rather than elected.   |
