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TOPIC/ISSUE	SUMMARY OF DISCUSSION AND/OR ACTION TAKEN
10:00	Chairman Cory Poole called the meeting to order, introductions were made. 33 present.
Agenda	Motion was made, seconded and passed to add the code compliance officer to the agenda.
Minutes	Motion was made, seconded and passed to accept the minutes as written for November 12, 2019.
Police Report	Officer Owings covered many concerns, including four motor homes in the Shopko parking lot; Salem Hospital using the K-Mart parking lot; boulders in the Cascades Gateway Park parking lot to prevent people from driving across the creek. Those from Sundial Mobile Home Park said people from the jail were a problem – using the facilities and crashing parties. Also addressed were the lack of sidewalks on Turner Road and the S curves on Lancaster.
City Council	Brad Nanke gave us an update on City Council business after a month off, including the homeless issue and a discussion about using Pringle Community Hall for a respite area, it could accommodate 37 people until March 31. The city keeps looking for buildings to house the homeless but there is not a lot of funding available. Other topics – May ballot to include the employee payroll tax; third Salem bridge although there is no evidence it will reduce traffic. Car camping – limited to 12 vehicles with the property owner’s permission, for example Church @ the Park. Council’s advice – don’t give to the homeless, donate to the proper agency itself.
Code Compliance	Anthony Hinkle stated that since January 3 they have done 212 inspections and there are 14 open cases. They have hired another abandoned vehicle officer. He states that if we see anything out of line we should call 503-588-6421 to talk to a real person. The law in mobile home parks regarding garbage or dumpster emptying was discussed.
Committee Reports	Land Use – 1. Land across from the Humane Society that is a marijuana processing location. 2. Miller Elementary School getting a new driveway.

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<p>Continued</p>	<p>3. The owner of a property at 4567 Campbell wants to buy a triangular piece of land has to clean up the legal issues. Annexation of property at Kuebler and 36th has a hearing on January 28. A 15 acre property to be divided into 2 acre lots with a non-profit located at the bottom of the parcel.</p> <p>Traffic - trees at the corner of Turner Road and Cascades Gateway Park will be trimmed when there is time. Still waiting to hear about the yellow light at Rickey and Lancaster.</p> <p>Transit - beginning Saturday service saw 7,000 to 8,000 riders and ridership has gone up 6 ½%. There is now wifi on all buses. May 3 starts Sunday and holiday service. The lift service operates the same hours as the buses.</p> <p>Airport - in December there was a total of 1788 operations, including 478 business and 46 overflights. The busiest day had 183. It was noted that a pilot flying into Salem at night can turn on the landing lights by clicking a clicker three times. The lights will turn off in 15 minutes.</p>
