Tory Banford of the City of Salem Urban Renewal gave us a heads up on a sale of the Panasonic/Sony building.

Camping/Cascades Gateway

A Zoom presentation with new Councilor Trevor Phillips and a discussion with Tom Andersen regarding homeless camping. David Macera gave a view from his Church at the Park. A lengthy, emotional and heated discussion followed. Cory said someone broke into the equipment building at Paradise and stole several thousands of dollars of equipment, the person was recognized as a homeless person from Cascades Gateway Park but couldn't be identified. How long will this keep going on? Will the Council end camping before/during Covid? No answers.

Committee Reports

Land Use – 1. 5730 Culver – approved. 2, 4512 Campbell Street. site for new duplex. 3. 4900 Turner Road site plan review. 4. 4195 Aumsville Highway. Alan Rasmussen explained the zone changes. He requested a letter showing SEMCA's support for the development. Motion was made, seconded and passed to submit same. Traffic – the tree at the entrance to Cascades Gateway Park has been trimmed but the light is out. Ron Sterba will ask for a curve ahead sign at the north entrance of Paradise Island and bicycle signs on Lancaster. Transit – Bob Krebs explained the precautions taken by the transit district because of Covid. Because of federal funding Salem is getting 5 new buses. Airport - for October there were 699 business, 117 over flights, 3264 fun, for a total of 4097 flights. Busy day was 244 flights.
