Contact our state representative to lobby for money to make proper improvements for bicycles/pedestrians on Turner Road. 3. Put a pedestrian bridge over Highway22 from Bill Reigel Park to Miller School. 4. Advocate for return of airline service.
Homeless Camping	Cory showed some slides taken last week and today which showed Walmart workers and Cory collecting 47 grocery carts recovered from the creek and in total over 100 carts recovered in Cascades Gateway Park. A city representative states that the park will be closed as of August 19, 2021. Anyone in the park after that date can be arrested for criminal trespass.
City Councilor	Tom Anderson gave us an update from the council viewpoint on the homeless camping and environmental change.
Committee Reports	<p>Traffic – fatal accident at Madrona and 25th. Ron Sterba is asking for dash lines through the intersection and a reduction of speed to 30 mph.</p> <p>Land Use – 5260 Gaffin Road school bus depot approved. 5730 Culver. 3565 Aumsville Highway. 2702 Lancaster.</p> <p>McDonald's wants a second drive thru lane.</p> <p>Airport - for July flights – 650 business. 181 over flights, 4118 fun, for a total of 4949. The busiest day was 244. There was a discussion about helicopter flight paths.</p>
