Announcements: Problem house 1545 Trade has been sold, improvements occurring. Plants for the Planet (\$250 Grant from SESNA) happening Saturday, Oct. 27.

Officers Report: Crime in Salem is low, mostly minor; vehicles being stolen during morning warming is increasing; reports of sex trafficking at Wal-Mart likely a hoax; problem house at 23<sup>rd</sup> and Claude is shut down; quarterly prescription drug take back is October 27.

Community Enforcement: Derelict house 1525 Lee has been demolished, also an improvement; there is a new online nuisance reporting form, may take some getting used to.

Neighborhood Concerns/Guest: Tara Baldridge, principal at Bush School, reported that traffic for pick-up/drop off at the school is in the midst of being reconfigured for flow and safety; more discussions with district, city traffic officials and the community upcoming to smooth out any remaining issues; Open House on the 30<sup>th</sup>.

Council Report: Single use plastic bag modification approved by council; Grocers Assn, Roth's in support; Salem Futures Open House at Broadway Commons on 10/24, look for future Futures meetings on city website; Volunteer Recognition on 10/26; permit for air b-n-b not denied, Council considering code change for historic areas.

Guest: Jodi Mahoney presented information about the Village Movement; it is a subscription based organization open to anyone 50 or older; there is now a VM forming in Salem; members help each other, watch over each other, work as a team; the North High and South High form the core area for Salem's Village Movement; for more info contact Neighborhood Connections South Salem.

Old Business: Plans are being finalized for this year's Annual Meeting/Open House; Annual Meeting will be on Saturday, November 10 from 4-6 at the Willamette Heritage Center Dye House.
