Co-use agreement expired in 2016, still under negotiations and is overly complicated. School and citizens should be able to reserve field and interact with less complication Aldrich Park improvements update – during announcements Aldrich Park survey update – 9 total surveys submitted. There is no fee for small organizations like SESNA to do survey, we can do a small section to test. Could promote through Bush School, Shannon will contact school to ask.
7:15 (7:30 – 8:00)	Council Updates - Tom Andersen, City Councilor for Ward 2 (if available) – Sally Cooke has resigned her council position, open for ward. Forum on Sit/Lie Ordinance at UGM went poorly, not enough time to hear people's opinions. New Forum happening at the Housing Authority, which will be more accessible for people that this impact. Requesting City Manager involvement to report on progress from Homelessness Task Force, not all things have been addressed. Continuing to advocate for addressing root causes and not just the symptoms. Ordinance comes before council probably in November. Added real estate transfer tax idea to his list. Revenue Task Force: 2/3 recommendations move forward – employee payroll tax (goes to citizens vote, funds will go to public safety) and operating fee tax (sliding scale \$8-38 per unit, plus relief if person qualifies for utility relief; passed 6-3 in council meeting).
