List of possible items for SWAN's grant request to Salem Parks Foundation:

Fircrest

Message board/kiosk (approximately \$1900)

- +New park sign
- +New trash receptacles
- +New basketball goals post, hoop, backboard

Bench

Nelson

- +Water fountain next to basketball and tennis courts (old, made of cement, dribbles water)
- +New tables
- +New benches (we had one approved last year and it is due to be installed May, 2021)
- +New trash receptacles
- +Repair fencing on tennis and basketball courts
- +Resurface tennis and basketball courts

Minto Brown

Entrance sign that states Minto is a Wildlife Refuge – this one needs some work as I want to notify the other 3 neighborhood association who serve Minto. Maybe next year? If enough interest.
