2021 Legislative Update: Senator Deb Patterson

Senate Healthcare, Housing, Natural Resources and Wildfire Recovery

Healthcare

Making healthcare more accessible and affordable for all Sponsored these bills:

SB 844 – Prescription Drug Affordability Review Board

HB 2623 - Cost of insulin limited to \$75

SB 763 – Licensing of drug reps

SB 428 - Task Force on Universal Health Care

SB 714 – Staffing ratios in LTC

SB 800 - Healthcare trust - LTC

Funding for Housing

\$765m for affordable housing and permanent supportive housing, down payment assistance, services to those who are unhoused, tenant support, landlord assistance, funds to preserve existing affordable housing, and more.

Funding for

\$7.5 million for Hope Plaza – Center for Hope and Safety-

\$6 million for the Salem YMCA Veteran's Housing

\$5 million for the navigation center which will open in November

Also sponsored SB 850 - homeless death reporting

ARPA Funds - Largest portion of the ARPA (Amer. Rescue Plan Act) funds to housing:

\$800K to ARCHES for purchase of a hotel (Project Turnkey)

\$500K to Center for Hope and Safety for their Project Turnkey

Also \$200K to help small businesses through Salem Chamber

\$200K to M/I Chamber (VISITING 40 businesses in 40 days)

\$200K to Willamette Career Academy (CTEC for region)

\$5.9 million to offset expiring tax credits

EDUCATION –

\$9.3 billion for K-12

\$150m for Summer Learning

\$5 million for Dept of Early Learning and Care

CHILDCARE -

\$95 million for employment related day care

Mental Health

\$470 m for Behavioral Health Services and substance abuse programs \$139m to increase capacity of housing and services for people with behavioral health needs,

\$121 million to support Cert. Comm. Behavioral Health Clinics (24/7) mental health & substance abuse treatment

\$80 million for increasing capacity and diversity of the behavioral health workforce.

\$10 million for mobile crisis intervention teams – CAHOOTS in Eugene.

\$9.2 million for YA transitional housing

\$6.5 million for mobile crisis response and stabilization for children.

\$5 million for a 9-8-8- crisis hotline center.
