Program: City of Salem Park System Update, Park Staff Pat Norman: parks overview: Introduction of Toni Whitler, Parks Planner. Overview of Salem City parks program (shared Slides) and recent history. A look ahead at the planning phase and upcoming possible sites. A few questions about process, selection, how developers are assessed fees, which become park funds and why. Discussion of pocket park, which is not presently, defined in the current Salem City parks planning process. Candalaria update: This 0.85 acre area is controlled by Salem City Water and is technically a reservoir. Salem water believes they may need to expand this facility in the future and are not inclined for it to become anything more than it is: Some small improvements may be permitted, but the limitations on anything larger than 12 inches high indicate improvements that may not be viable for the area. Any park like improvements made may come with maintenance responsibilities, which the Water department looks after now.	40 min
Committee Reports: Land Use, Ted Burney Tree update: A significant tree definition proposal is under review in the City Planning office. New regulations for size of trees and a permit process to arrange for any proposed removal.	15 min
Shurman Drive project: Recommended for re-zoning. Moving to the next phase.	
Commercial Pedestrian Walkway. This is being suggested, but with no clear path to funding, this will be a shovel ready project looking for funds.
